

Proclamation

OFFICE OF THE MAYOR

WHEREAS, the City of Cedar Hill, Texas, is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depend on the safety and essential role our homes, buildings and infrastructure play, both in everyday life and when disasters strike, and;

WHEREAS, our confidence in the resilience of the buildings that make up our community is achieved through the devotion of vigilant guardians (building safety and fire prevention officials, architects, engineers, builders, tradespeople, design professionals, laborers, plumbers and others in the construction industry) who work year-round to ensure the safe construction of buildings, and;

WHEREAS, these guardians are dedicated members of the International Code Council (ICC), a nonprofit that brings together local, state, territorial, tribal and federal officials who are experts in the built environment to create and implement the highest-quality codes and standards to protect us in the buildings where we live, learn, work and play, and;

WHEREAS, these modern building codes and standards include safeguards to protect the public from hazards such as hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildland fires, floods and earthquakes, and;

WHEREAS, Building Safety Month is sponsored by ICC to remind the public about the critical role of our communities' largely unknown protectors of public safety—our code officials—who assure us of safe, sustainable, and affordable buildings that are essential to our communities' prosperity, and;

WHEREAS, "Built to Last", the theme for Building Safety Month 2026, encourages us all to get involved and raise awareness about the importance of building safety within our community on a personal, local and global scale, and;

WHEREAS, each year, in observance of Building Safety Month, people all over the world are asked to consider the commitment to improve building safety, resilience, and economic investment at home and in the community, and to acknowledge the essential services provided to all of us by local, state, tribal, territorial, and federal building safety and fire prevention departments in protecting lives and property.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Stephen Mason, Mayor of Cedar Hill, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2026 as

BUILDING SAFETY MONTH

in the City of Cedar Hill, Texas. Accordingly, I encourage our citizens to join us as we participate in Building Safety Month activities.
